NCW, the highest specialized national machinery for the advancement of women in Egypt.





Egyptian Constitution 2014

For the 1st time, 20 Articles dedicated to addressing women's issues

- Ensure equal opportunities for women
- > Transfer the nationality to their children
- > Allocate a quarter of the seats of local councils for women
- Social, economic and political rights
- Social security services
- Prevent discrimination
- Protection against all forms of violence,
- > Women's empowerment in all spheres
- Commitment to care at various stages of the lives
- Commitment to the international conventions on human rights, which all includes the rights for women

National Strategy for the Empowerment of Egyptian Women 2030

Egypt is the **first country globally** to launch its National Women strategy 2030 aligned with **the SDGs and Egypt vision 2030** confirming the country's commitment to achieve the empowerment of Egyptian women.

In March 2017, The Egyptian President announced and endorsed the National strategy for the Empowerment of Egyptian Women to be the national policy and guiding document for the Government.

• 175,000 contribute in developing of the strategy (Ministers Governors – parliamentarians – youth – 180 civil society)







Empowering Women in Economic sphere

- Unemployment rate among women has decreased from 24% in 2014 to 21.4% in 2018 to 19.6% in the first quarter of 2019
- Percentage of women holding bank accounts has increased from 9% in 2015 to 27% in 2017.
- Percentage of SMEs dedicated for women has increased from 23% in 2015 to 46% in 2018
- Percentage of microfinance loans dedicated for women has increased from 45% in 2015 to 69% in 2018
- Percentage of women investors in stock exchange is 30%
- Percentage of women working in governmental agencies is 44.5%
- > Beneficiaries of MSMEs is 3 million, 70% of which are women up to 2018
- > 500 Microfinance institutions in Egypt



Financial Inclusion

The Government of Egypt has recently taken concrete strategic steps to enhance the financial inclusion for women such as:

(1) A presidential decree has been issued in Feb 2017 to establish a National Council for Payments, with the President of the Republic being the head of the Council.

(2) Celebrating the First ever year (2017) of women in Egypt and activating the Economic empowerment pillar in the National Women strategy 2030, The National council for Women signed a **Memorandum of understanding with the Central bank of Egypt (CBE)**; which places Egypt as the **first Country** to have its CBE sign an agreement with a National Women machinery worldwide.



Empowering Women in Economic sphere

Financial Inclusion

- > Two credit lines exclusively targeting women to finance women entrepreneurs
- > 3 million beneficiaries of **microfinance** in Egypt, 70% of them are women
- > 880 trained women in all governorates of Egypt on financial inclusion topics
- Raising the awareness of 50,000 women on ground on banking products and financial services during 2018
- > National Campaign on the awareness of financial inclusion concepts through PSAs
- Production of "Elmasrya" E-catalogs to help market products of Egyptian women in areas with less access to services



Entrepreneurship Skills & Development

- Two production units have been established and branded by Al Mashgel through Women's Leadership, Empowerment, Access & Protection in Crisis Response (LEAP) project, funded by the government of Japan and implemented in partnership with UN Women and Care Egypt. The names of these units is Al Mashghel allocated in zahraa Maadi and NCW Giza branch.
- The production unit aims to employ up to 50 women fully through its activities to make a monthly income of 2,200 EGP. 2 more units has been established in Menia NCW branch and Gharbiya governorate to scale up successful models.
- A product development program called "Addaha W2doud" is being implemented which targets craftswomen all over the governorates of Egypt to upgrade their products' quality and design to meet market needs and requirements.

Empowering Women in Economic sphere

«Gender Equality Seal» Award in Partnership with UNDP:

- Egypt is the 1st Arab country and the 2nd globally to develop a certification program for government and private sector based on the success of the gender equality seal
- The Seal provides Egyptian companies guidance on how to address challenges for women, such as access to work, wage inequities, sexual harassment, work-life balance and access to leadership positions.
- 10 Private sector companies have undergone a thorough process of assessment
- In 2019 , the 1st agency to be granted the seal is the medium, small and micro enterprises development agency (MSMEDA)
- The Egyptian private sectors Companies have started to implement Women Empowerment principles





- ➢ 54% of universities students are females
- ➢ 46.5% of Masters and Ph.D. holders are females
- ➢ 48.6% of professors in universities are females
- 89% women benefiting from social protection programs (2.25 million households 10 million individuals)
- > 235% increase in cash transfer budget (through Takaful and Karama Program)
- Dedication of 250 million Egyptian pounds to child care services from the national budget
- > 65% of the beneficiaries of training programs for Government agencies are women.
- > 38 million women benefited from bread and flour subsidiary
- > 34 million women benefited from food ration cards
- > 10 million women benefited from health care support
- > 8 million women benefited from family and reproductive health services

Conditional Cash transfer program "Takaful and Karama"


2,000,000 women (80% women beneficiaries of the program) to improve:

- household consumption,
- Boosting human capital through conditionality,
- Increasing women's control over decision making,
- Improve economic productive inclusion,
- increase financial inclusion of women
- Reduce violence against women.





- Decent housing for the most vulnerable households.
- New projects were launched to build around 250,000 housing units for indecent housing inhabitants, with the objective of developing and impoverished villages into proper districts in to guarantee a safe and decent life for citizens. This has direct impact on the safety and wellbeing of many women and girls.
- Social programs and camps conducted to the decent housing programs reaching out to 4330 beneficiary.



Social Empowerment

Efforts to combat breast cancer

- Early detection of breast cancer for 13,750 women in all governorates of Egypt through the branches of the National Council of Women.
- Early detection of breast cancer for 10,350 women in collaboration with the Center for Women's Health in the Ministry of Health and Population, the Institute of Oncology and Nasser Institute.

Bahia

- Early detection of 28,511 women.
 - 35 rooms with a total value of 5 million and 860 thousand Egyptian pounds.
- On Mother's Day, Admission of 138 cases on waiting list with a total value of 4 million and 666 thousand Egyptian Pounds.

The campaign reached out to around 6 million women on the ground over 3 years. The campaign relies on face to face communication with women in villages. It addresses topics such as:

- Violence against women
- personal status law
- legal rights, risks of FGM
- political participation of women
- other women issues





- Egypt launched three national strategies; the National Strategy to Combat Violence against Women, the National Strategy to Combat Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), and the National Strategy to Combat Early Marriage
- Around 60,000 women beneficiaries of the Complaints office services of NCW -up to 2018 through the main branch and the 27 branches in the governorates by providing legal and social services (Victim advocate System, Legal Support, Family Courts and VAW cases)
- Establishment of 18 anti-harassment units in universities.
- Upgrading shelters for women victims of violence under the supervision of the Ministry of Social Solidarity
- 440 general hospitals integrated Gender Based Violence (GBV) comprehensive package of health services and capacitated service providers to provide services for victims

- > Equal Opportunity units in all ministries
- Family court established to safeguard women & children
- Sector established in the Ministry of Justice "Women & Child Rights"
- Manual for the public prosecution official on VAW cases
- Training of law enforcements (700 representatives from the prosecution and the judiciary bodies on Violence against Women.)
- The Government of Egypt has been working on a comprehensive law for Violence against women that is intended to be passed by the Egyptian Parliament
- Manual on Violence against Women (VAW) in Islam was launched by Al Azhar to train religious leaders
- Launch of the Egypt Economic Cost of Gender Based Violence Survey to support evidence based policy-making (2015). Egypt is the First Arab country to conduct this survey.





The National Committee for the eradication of FGM

- The National committee for the eradication of FGM falls under the leadership of NCW and NCCM
- The first inaugural task force meeting took place in May 2019
- It was officially launched to commemorate the national FGM day on 13th of June 2019



- The committee's role is to coordinate all the efforts of FGM between the national stakeholders, ministries, international organizations as well as civil society
- A National Action Plan with its strategic framework will be developed by end 2019 and launched early 2020 to set the agenda for FGM In Egypt and reach the 2030 target.






