Founded in August of 2011, Ein el-Sultan Training Centre in Jericho is the sole **UNRWA Training Centre for employees in** West Bank and provides Human Resource-focused training. UNRWA provides trainings at the Ein El Sultan center to new and existing staff on a range of

Further, the center provides work opportunities for women through the Women's Centre in Ein El Sultan Camp as well as other nearby Women's centers. The latter provide catering and cooking services for the training center. The Women who take part in cooking and catering are able to gain valuable experience by catering for the training center which operates for 40 responsible for meals and refreshments, and sources their ingredients locally from the camps. The Women's Centre uses the money to pay the women who prepare the food, and to cover the cost of ingredients and equipment. They also use part of the income to fund other activities within the Women's Centre. As a result, the training center has been crucial in empowering the local community, allowing individuals, particularly women, to become self-reliant and industry-savvy.
